#### 7th Sunday of Easter

Unity and diversity can exist together. Our western minds have a grave difficulty seeing unity without conformity. We tend to believe that unless everyone believes the same thing, assents to the same body of truths, styles, and opinions, unity is not pos-

sible. Jesus, in today's Gospel, expresses a tenderness and an intimacy that the disciples actually can witness. This same tenderness and love are also reflected in his desire for unity and oneness. Jesus passionately wants all to be one. It is very clear that the success of Jesus' mission and the advance of the Gospel rises or falls with whether this unity is achieved. And it is a unity that is achieved around a person and not particulars.

Our church is extremely divided. These divisions all center on various theologies, philosophies, structures, and styles. We allow these particular concerns and interpretations, valid as many can be, to drive wedges between us and put us at odds with each other. They enrage us and cause us to lash out at other members of the Body of Christ. Differences are bound to exist in any group. We are unique and diverse people. Staunchly clinging to particular agendas and ideologies while waving the "we're right, you're wrong" banner as we forge ahead in battle does little to advance the real mission of Christ. We are perceived as weak, fractioned, self-focused and serving, and lacking empathy and love. How can the work of salvation be accomplished like this? We sacrifice our credibility. For what?

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end." These words describe exactly who the glorified Christ really is. Jesus wants us to see this glory! Believe this! This is the unifying principle that draws the Body of Christ together as one, not our particular preferences of worship! We give too much power to our preferences, and all too easily forget that the real mission of Christ is much more than that! If we can work at truly loving each other as members of Christ's Body despite the differences that can so quickly divide us, then maybe we'll a bit more convincing to those who do not believe. The Risen Christ comes to us through the Eucharist. It doesn't matter where or how. Gather wherever you can and receive. We cannot substitute Jesus' passion with our own. We are one.

#### Organ Dedication Concert Wrap-Up

We celebrate our performers and thank them for sharing their talent with us. God has blessed them in an extra-ordinary way!

**Rob Abbot** - Rob has been our organist at St. Matthew for these past six weeks. He has brought with him his experiences as the music director of the Shrine of the Little Flower Basilica and has been recently performing as a freelance musician. Rob received his Masters in Organ from the University of Michigan and is a graduate of Hope College. He has received many honors, most notably the Robert Glasgow Scholarship in Organ Performance in 1999. He is happy to be at St. Matthew's and enjoys serving other congregations as well.

**Dr. Ronald Prowse** - Dr. Prowse studied music and organ performance under many well known professors including Marilyn Mason. He received his Doctorate in Organ Performance at the University of Michigan in 1992. He continued his study of improvisation and composition at La-Trinite in Paris, France. He was appointed Associate Professor at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in 2004 and is now retired.

Dr. Prowse teaches organ at Sacred Heart and as a member of the adjunct faculty at Wayne State University. He has performed organ concerts in the United States and Europe. Ron conducts lectures on organ performance and has published many articles in national journals. He has recently released a world premiere recording through Albany Records, "Organ Works of Ned Rorem."

**Joe Balistreri** - Joe earned his degrees in Organ Performance at the University of Michigan. He has performed at the American Guild of Organists and National Association of Pastoral Musicians conventions, university conferences, and orchestral collaborations.

From 2011 to 2021, Joe served as coordinator of Music Ministries for the Archdiocese of Detroit and was the Director of Music at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral. In this capacity, he re-built the choral programs, establishing the Archdiocesan Chorus, the Cathedral Choir Academy, and the Schola Cantorum Detroitensis.

Currently, Joe is the Musician-in-Residence at Christ Church Cranbrook where he serves as organist, conductor, composer, and consultant to the church's music program.

Joe will begin his doctoral studies at the University of Notre Dame in the fall.

We are truly grateful to these gentlemen for participating in our Organ Concert on May 15. They were willing to share their talent with us and gave our community a new appreciation and respect for the "King of Instruments."
